The IBC Really is International & The Jose Ramirez Band Wows Memphis!

Carol Salsbury and I went to our first International Blues Challenge (IBC) in Memphis on January 28, 2020. We didn't know what to expect but knew there were going to be about 250 bands and solo/duo contestants there plus a few thousand blues fans from all around the world coming to town. The following are some of my notes from the 5 days in Memphis.

The IBC really is an international event. We met bands and fans from Croatia, Norway, the U.K., and saw wonderful bands from Australia, Switzerland, Holland, Sweden, Ottawa, and the Baltic and many other countries, all playing original music.

The days were filled with showcases organized by talent agencies and workshops. There were master class workshops featuring legendary performers like Bob Margolin, Bob Corritore,

Victor Wainwright, and Tony Braunagel. Everyday there were events for younger musicians trying to break into the business. After the IBC events, there were at least 5 jams going on in clubs on Beale Street every night. Some were showcases for record companies or talent agencies, and some were called "all star jams."

The Blues Foundation put on a few special events including a roundtable discussion for leaders from Blues Societies and a session on getting grants and sponsorships.

The "battles" were held in clubs up and down Beale Street. There were 11 clubs featuring bands and 9 clubs had solo/duo contests. It was a "challenge" to decide what club to go into and at what time. Most clubs for the Wednesday - Thursday quarterfinals had 9 or 10 bands or solo/duo groups playing and only 3 bands from each club would advance to the semifinals on Friday. The competition was at a very high level.

When we went to see the Jose Ramirez Band play Wednesday night, the place was packed and we saw two incredible bands play before Jose's set. But when the MC said "representing the DC Blues Society, the Jose Ramirez Band," I cheered as loud as I could. It was so cool to watch Jose and the band win over the crowd.

We came back for the 2nd night of the Quarterfinals and the crowd cheered even louder when Jose and the band were introduced. I was wearing my DC Blues Society hat and people were saying how much they liked "our guys."

We had a long wait on Friday to find out who was advancing to the semifinals and finally heard the Jose Ramirez Band had advanced to the semifinals! The club they were in was packed and we had to stand in the back of the club. The energy level from all the bands and crowd was intense, with so much on the line. After their set, we congratulated Jose and band and went out to see other bands. The streets were full of people roaming from one club to another.

On Saturday morning, we had to wait to find out who would advance and then we saw that Jose and the band had made the finals! People saw my DC Blues Society hat and said "congratulations" on Jose and band advancing to the finals. Later that afternoon, the band played another great set in the finals and then everyone had to wait until all the judges' scorecards were counted. When we arrived back at BWI airport, we checked our phones and saw the results were out and the Jose Ramirez Band came in 2nd Place! What an amazing accomplishment for the band! *Continued on p. 4*



We had such a good time that we plan to go back to the IBC next year, but it will be very hard to top the excitement of the 2020 IBC.



Bands to the left of me, restaurants to the right, here I am in the middle of the Legendary Rhythm & Blues Cruise #34. Oh my goodness, where to begin. Taj Mahal, Tab Benoit, Victor Wainwright, Vanessa Collier, Ruthie Foster, can't forget sweet Ruthie, Guy Davis, well, I'll think of more later. But you get the idea. Mitch Woods Club 88 was playing in the piano lounge before the ship even sailed. So many choices, so little time.

I told the powers-that-be at WPFW that I was taking a week off to do research. That's my excuse every time I go and neither they nor I believe it. But this time, I really was doing research

on musicians I had never seen or maybe even never heard of. And I found some folks that need to be heard in the DMV. Starting with Jontavious Willis, usually solo, but this time with Andrew Ali on harmonica. You must see him. He's serious about keeping traditional acoustic blues alive.



Marcella Simian was new to me, but now I'm a big fan. Working with her father Terrance Simian, then with others, and then on her own in the piano bar, she wrings every bit of emotion from a song.

John Hammond told stories of hanging out with Charlie Musselwhite and Mike Bloomfield during his early days. My goodness, the man has worked and partied with everyone.

R.I.P. - Reggie Wayne Morris (February 28, 1953 - February 4, 2020)

The DC, Maryland and Virginia blues scene is mourning the sudden loss of guitarist/ singer/songwriter Reggie Wayne Morris on February 4, 2020. He was 66 years old. Reggie was raised on his grandparents' farm in Charlottesville, VA and was reared on Gospel and Blues, learning the guitar at an early age from musical family members. Reggie was based in Baltimore, MD. His up-tempo rock-edged style developed from listening to Jimi Hendrix and B.B. King and fusing their influences with his own unique approach to create his "Boogie Woogie Rhythm & Rockin' Blues" that allowed him to tour Italy, France, Hawaii and the U.S. with an appearance at Carnegie Hall as a "Career Milestone." Reggie had the sole distinction of being the only artist to perform at the Baltimore Blues Society Festival for nine consecutive years.

His last CD, *Don't Bring Me Daylight*, paid homage to both the past and present Blues scene with contemporary witty lyrics that spoke to current Blues fans, with all original songs composed by himself and Gerald Robinson.

Reggie appeared at many area clubs including JV's and the Westminster Church "Blue Monday's;" at regional festivals including Artscape, The West Virginia Blues & Brews Fest, and the Silver Spring Blues Fest; and shows for the DC Blues Society. In 2017, Reggie was inducted into the Maryland Entertainment Hall of Fame for his Contributions to the History of Entertainment in Maryland. In 2020 Reggie was planning to release a new CD and was looking forward to live performances throughout the Mid-Atlantic and beyond.

A memorial service was held on Thursday, February 13 at the Walker's Life Memorial Center in Brooklyn, Maryland. The DC Blues Society sends our condolences to Reggie's family, friends and fans. You can send memories and condolences to 907 Shamrock Ct., Glen Burnie, MD 21060. R.I.P. Reggie.



Award Winner Billy Price is Back and Soulful as Ever

On Friday, March 13, Billy Price will be appearing at the City Winery DC. If the name sounds familiar it's because Billy has performed in the area many times over the years. A 2016 Blues Music Award (BMA) Winner and two-time 2020 BMA nominee, Billy Price first attracted national attention during his three-year association with DC guitar legend, Roy Buchanan. Price is the vocalist on two of Buchanan's LPs, *That's What I'm Here For* and *Live Stock*. Since then, with the Keystone Rhythm Band, the Billy Price Band, and solo projects, Billy Price has recorded and released a total of 17 albums, CDs, and DVDs. In April 2016, he was officially recognized and inducted as a Pittsburgh Rock 'n Roll Legend at an award ceremony.

Price's album *This Time for Real* on Vizztone Records, with the late Chicago soul singer Otis Clay, received a 2016 Blues Music Award in the category of Best Soul Blues Album of 2015. His 2018 album *Reckoning*, produced by Kid Andersen at Greaseland Studios for Vizztone, was nominated for a 2019 Blues Music Award in the category of Best Soul Blues Album of 2018. His new album *Dog Eat Dog*, also produced by Andersen, was released by Mike Zito's Gulf Coast Records in August, 2019 and is nominated for a 2020 BMA for Best Soul Blues Album of 2019 .He was also nominated for a 2020 BMA for Best Male Soul Blues Artist.

Maryland won the blues lottery when Billy Price moved to Baltimore after 50 years dominating the Pittsburgh blues scene. Between blues, soul, funk, R'n'B, Motown and Philly sound, *Dog Eat Dog* represents the perfect blend of Price's musical history. He does it all on this new CD and at his live shows. Victor Wainwright tore up World Stage Theater with a Classic Legendary Blues Show. (The first thing you notice is how much weight he has lost. He's 1/3 of his former self and looking gooood!). He also educated the audience about the history and progression of the Blues as he was entertaining us.

Vanessa Collier's shows were standing room only and she did not disappoint. She quickly became a fan favorite and participated in several other shows, including the Returnees Party, even hosting a jam.

Guy Davis performed to standing room only crowds whether he was solo or working with Anne Harris and Marcella Simian as part of "Gumbo, Grits, and Gravy." The three of them shared the stage and gave us a great show, with Guy on guitar & harp, Anne on fiddle, and Marcella on keyboards. A few days later, they attempted the culinary demonstration. None of them were taking it too seriously, especially after Terrance Simian joined them, trash talking each other during the segments. Fortunately, there were printed directions because we were all laughing too hard to take notes. And, it was my luck to sit at a table with some folks from Louisiana who explained the finer points of roux to me. The real shipboard chefs made the recipes and provided samples.

There were panel discussions in addition to the culinary demonstration, such as it was. Ana Popovic, Ruthie Foster, Anne Harris, Marcella Simien, Vanessa Collier, Thornetta Davis all participated in a panel discussion about their lives in the Blues. The Rev. Billy C. Wirtz gave a talk on how Gospel and R&B have influenced and 'borrowed' from each other from the start. Bob Porter talked on Big Joe Turner. And harmonica and the guitar workshops drew huge crowds.

Every day is a theme day and on Mardi Gras day, we were treated to a second line through the dining room. Had us waving our napkins.

There was so much to do and see, and eat, with stops in Mexico, Guatemala, and Honduras. At one point I ran into long-time DC Blues Society President Felix McClairen and his friend Antonia enjoying their first Blues Cruise.

Don't get me started on the food. The food was great, even in the buffet, and I spent more than a little time trying to figure out how to kidnap the chef and get him into my suitcase. But alas, all good things must come to an end. And the cruise returned to Fort Lauderdale. That's alright, tho, I'm already signed up for the Cruise #35.




